- We will be exploring various themes from our workbook, such as: school life\class, family, seasons, Israel, various lifestyles around the world etc.. Each theme has relevant vocabulary and short stories that students will be encouraged to put to use, both orally and written. We will also work on proper grammar and pronunciation. We will create projects where students will make connections with the material and their daily lives. Ex:
- To enhance learning, we will use various tools such as Flipgrid, wordwall, Kahoot,
 Nearpod, Quizlet, Edpuzzle, Jamboard etc..

- Students will learn the parashiot in their original texts, broken down and further discussed in detail.
- Students will demonstrate understanding and connection through open discussion, interactives activities, reflection and dramatic skits or art.

- We will continue to review and expand our tefillah (Prayers) routines, and brachot (blessings) relevant to important Jewish rituals
- We will review and expand our knowledge of Shabbat and our chagim (holidays) and their customs and rituals
- We will learn about Jewish values and the importance of being part of our Jewish community and partaking in various mitzvot such as: loving Israel, Tzedakah
- These themes will be ongoing throughout the year



- Oral communication -Students will build their vocabulary base and learn common phrases by engaging in regular conversational activities both in person and using the Parlay app.
- Reading skills Regular in class and homework short texts as well as student engagement in various exercises and tasks. Progress will be monitored through one on one teacher observations as well as individual student recordings on Flipgrid
- Writing skills Writing\typing skills will be evaluated regularly through writing in Hebrew workbooks, in their notebooks- Machbarot as short responses and in regular student blog posts on their personal blogs.
